The Scoop on Spiders

Many people think spiders are insects. They are not insects at all. There are several **webs** spiders are different. Spiders have bodies that are in two parts. The fatter back part is called the **abdomen**. The front part where the head and chest are found, is the **thorax**. Some spiders are big and some are small. But they all have eight legs. All life on Earth depends on a single star. This star is about 93 million miles away. Without it, the earth would be too cold, and the planets would die. We would be in total darkness.

This important star is the sun. The sun is much bigger than any planet. It has a diameter of about 864,000 miles. The sun is made of hot gases. Most of the sun is hydrogen and helium.

Talk about hot! The sun is about 10,000 °F on its surface. Deep inside, near its core, it reaches about 27 million °F.
